# FORMER HF NET MAKES A COMEBACK...

The old M&M SAP Net (Sunday Afternoon Party) that was a fixture on 3907 during the 40's 50's 60's and 70's has reappeared. Thanks to Jim, KS8O, an HF net has been started on 3860 +-

QRM, every Sunday at 1pm. This should give some new upcoming Generals an opportunity to get involved with HF, and encourage others to upgrade, now that there is a net for them to participate in.

The first net on Sunday, Oct. 22 brought in six hams, and lasted almost 45 minutes. Each week a different topic of conversation will be presented for anyone to comment on. Of course, you can also check "in and out" but the whole idea of an HF net is to encourage everyone to participate and talk about your experience with ham radio, yours or other's radio gear, and general comments about ham radio or related topics. The new net is really a revival of an old one that had wide popularity. It will be called the "SAP Net II" (Sunday Afternoon Party) and is open to all licensed hams. We have already received a positive report from a former local ham now living in the Madison area. With time, Jim and all of us are hoping this net will have a wide acceptance, and give us some quality HF time on Sunday PM. Of course, noon Packer games may take their toll, but when they are not playing at noon, at half time, and when the season ends, all should have time to check in and join a great group of hams.

# M&M NET CONTINUES WIDE SUPPORT...

The Sunday evening "candy net" continues to draw many check ins, usually 20 plus, and more often 25 to 30 and upward. All hams are welcome to check in, and listen to local comments, club activities, ARRL audio news, and now, a special segment covering activities at the D.A.R. ham radio station.

Many check "in and out", but you can also check in " short time" which means you will be given priority and called upon right away, regardless of when you check in.

### ANNUAL SKYWARN SPECIAL EVENT...

The weekend of December 1st will again be the focus of the National Skywarn special event, which features NWS stations on the air from all

over the U.S. Everything will begin at 6pm CDT on both HF and local repeaters. Locally, the Green Bay station WX9GRB will solicit contacts most likely over the 147.000 repeater as they have previously. The Marquette station, WX8MQT will probably be looking for contacts in our area over the 146.880 repeater. A contact with just one NWS station will qualify you for an attractive certificate. Those of you with HF capabilities can work for a number of certificate levels depending on how many U.S. stations you contact. We have a high level of trained spotters in our area, and encourage as many of you as possible to monitor your radios and answer the NWS stations when they call.
