60TH ANNIVERSARY CHARTER NIGHT...

The M&M ARC is marking a very special milestone, 60 years of ARRL Affiliation. The 60th Anniversary Charter Night will be held Saturday April 24th at Schusslers in Peshtigo. Our special guest will be Michigan Section Manager Dale Williams, WA8EFK. We'll be taking a look back at Ham Radio in 1949, debut the updated club history book, and present the 2009 Ham of the Year Award. Mark your calendar, and look for the RSVP form in the next Ground Wave.

WISCONSIN QSO PARTY...

The 2010 Wisconsin QSO Party will be held Sunday March 14th from 1pm to 8pm CDT. This is the contest where Wisconsin stations can work everyone, but everyone out-of-state can work only Wisconsin. Each county is a

multiplier, so there will be plenty of stations looking for you if you're a Wisconsin station. There's plenty of activity on the VHF and UHF bands, as well as on HF. Changes this year include a Beginners category, some changes in the Canadian multiplierss and abbreviations, and a prohibition on using VHF and UHF National Calling Frequencies. Instead suggested simplex frequencies are:52.530, 146.550, 223.52, and 446.025.

There is a club competition, and we encourage as many members to get on and submit their scores on behalf of the M&M ARC as possible. Only Wisconsin-based scores count towards the Wisconsin Club competition.

The DAR Boys and Girls Club station K8DAR will be operationing portable 9 from the QTH of Chris Rohde, 138 North Lake Street in Peshtigo. Any operators who would like to help out the young hams from the DAR are invited to join in on March 14th.

Jim K8IR, and Eric, KG9GH will once again be mobile with an ambitious 20 county route planned. They will be operating mostly CW on 80, 40, and 20 (and maybe 15). Please look for them, and pick up a extra few multipliers. Eric plans to have his APRS beacon on, so you can follow their progress.

THE MAGIC OF AMATEUR RADIO...

I caught this recent post on the CQ Contest Reflector written by Doug Smith, W7KF who did a wonderful job of capturing why the hobby, particularly HF operating, remains a passion to so many hams in an internet age:

"The magic of HF radio communication is that it does NOT require a hundred billion dollars worth of infrastructure. It does not require undersea cables, satellites in orbit, countless microwave relay sites, cell sites, ISPs, packet switched networks, servers, routers, investment bankers or stockholders. NONE OF THAT.

HF radio communication only requires a couple of guys with some relatively simple gear and

antennas. Maybe they even built their own gear out of scrounged parts. Maybe their antenna is a bit of wire strung up in a tree. These guys generate RF and launch it into the ether, bound for parts unknown. Some other guy picks up a few millionths of a volt of that puny signal and carefully nurtures it, amplifies it, converts it to audio and decodes it. And then the process reverses and we have a QSO in the log. That is *magic* and it makes your heart beat a little faster. Just imagine it!

Sending an email, talking on a cell phone -- yes, amazing technology. I suppose the current term would be "awesome". But, it has no soul. It is as empty as a politicians promise. It's just a phone call. Or an email. Or a spot on the cluster. It has *no* magic."

Those of us who have experienced it know the magic he's talking about. Well said, Doug.
